What does the Parish council do?

Paglesham Parish Council consists of 5 councillors and 1 member of staff. The parish council strives to improve the quality of life for the residents of the village. All parish councillors form part of the Paglesham Village Trust (PVT) and are therefore trustees of the village.

What is the Parish Council responsible for?

The Parish Council is responsible for the following:

- Street lighting
- Maintenance and updating of noticeboards
- Maintenance of the village defibrillators
- Providing grants to local community groups
- General village maintenance
- Consulted on all local parish planning applications

News in general:

The Plough and Sail

Car park flooding continues to be a problem after heavy rain at The Plough and Sail. Continued lobbying by the Parish Council and Rochford District Council have resulted in Essex County Council commissioning an

investigation into a long-term solution that will prevent the pub car park from flooding in the future.

Frances Field

This green field area has, for some time now, been a village asset, making it available to our community as a site where children can play, a place where families can picnic and dogs can be walked as well, of course, as the location for the Paglesham village show in the summer. The field is regularly maintained by members of the PVT and PVPA so that we can all enjoy the field at its best. HMS Beagle

As a result of funding secured by The Parish Council from Rochford District Council, railings and an information board have been erected by the anchor installation in Frances' Field to commemorate the village's connections with HMS Beagle which Charles Darwin sailed on. Another information board is to be erected soon along the sea wall at the site of the dry dock where the boat was once moored.

On the Parish Council, his primary functions are to advise councillors on all the legal aspects of Parish Council decision making and, as Responsible Financial Officer, to advise and keep up to date all aspects of the Councils' financial transactions.

Val McVittie sadly decided to step down from her role as a Parish Councillor in the summer after a period of more than 20 years. In recognition of her dedicated service, an award was made to Val by the Parish Council on behalf of the village. Boat shed at Shuttlewood's Boatyard

The boat shed at Shuttlewood's Boatyard, which is a grade 1 listed building was destroyed reportedly (according to a local newspaper) by the recent high winds. The Parish Council is liaising with Rochford District Council to establish what next steps can be taken relating to the possible restoration of the boat shed so that it will be sympathetic to the original nature of the structure.



Bleed kit

Due to the remote location of our village and, therefore, the inevitable long response times of the emergency services to attend an incident in Paglesham, the Parish Council has secured a bleed kit for the village which is housed in the defibrillator location in East End (the former telephone box in near the Plough and Sail pub). This kit is designed to treat major injuries or control bleeding until professional medical treatment can be received.

Paglesham oyster pit jetty repaired

The jetty, which once housed a seat overlooking the river but which was destroyed due to a tragic incident a few summers ago, has now been repaired on behalf of The Paglesham Village Trust due to funding provided by Shuttlewood's Boatyard.

The Parish Council is pleased at the return of The Punchbowl in Church End to the centre of the community following its closure 6 years ago. We as a Parish Council congratulate Sally and Rob Beaumont on their opening in January and wish them well with their new venture. Speed limit

The Parish Council, following complaints made by local residents at the speed of certain vehicles into and out of the village, has agreed to support a 30 mile per hour speed limit for the whole of the Paglesham Road. The process of changing a road speed limit is, however, a long and arduous one and can only take effect if there is sufficient support.

Decisions regarding changes to the speed limit can only be made by Essex Highways and so residents who would like a change to the speed limit are requested to contact Essex Highways direct with their complaint.

Stephenson's bus service

Stephenson's of Essex provide the 60 and 60A services to and from Southend. This service is funded by Essex County Council. Due to budget restrictions, ECC is regularly reviewing the provision of its bus services and if we as a community fail to make the most of this service, we face losing it. Currently a single ticket from Paglesham to Southend is subsidised and capped at £2 (and so cheaper than using the car for the day!!)

Essex Mobile Library Service

Paglesham is fortunate to receive visits from Essex Mobile Library Service on Fridays every 3 weeks stopping opposite The Plough and Sail Pub between 12.15 and 12.45. The visit dates for the rest of 2024 are as follows:

Trees for the village
